It is customary when switching the radio on, to listen for a least the duration of one normal 'over' before transmitting.

Then, if conversation is heard, and you decide that you would like to join in, the procedure is to transmit the one word "break" or "breaker", preferably between "overs", and wait until invited to identify yourself and join the party. Adherence to these guide-lines ensures you don't obliterate what might be an important message and that you don't irritate other users.

Club Frequencies

Many other Four Wheel Drive Clubs and individuals operate on UHF channel 10, and are encouraged for safety reasons to do so. When we are on a trip and the frequency is busy, the Trip Leader will advise our party to change to another channel.
